# Hole in My Soul

When I came into AA, I was living in one of my father's rental apartments. I didn't see any problem with this. I had no job skills and no real job history.

I was a spoiled brat who was used to getting her way, no matter the cost or the consequences. I was 34 years old, and I had an 8-year-old hellion of a child. I felt that my parents should either pay my rent or let me live with them for free while I was in the middle of my third divorce.

One morning, I called my hairdresser to schedule a haircut and she seemed rather chilly on the phone. "I can't believe you're calling me," she snapped. I was confused by her statement since, as far as I knew, we hadn't spoken since her wedding. "I'm sorry," I said. "Are you OK?"

Her answer was stark. "You ruined my wedding," she said. I felt as if the blood in my veins had turned to ice water. We were friends with a long history. We drank together. "What happened?" I asked. Then she told me what I had done, being gracious enough to keep the details to a minimum. "Never call me again," she said, then hung up.

This was just one more negative repercussion of the bad decisions I made in that last year of drinking. My home life was in shambles. My social life was gone, and I was reduced to writing bad checks and using credit cards to get my alcohol. I was also barely parenting my son. He was completely out of control and I had convinced myself that his behavior caused me to drink, not the other way around. I conned myself into believing I was "doing my best" as a mom.

After my hairdresser rejected me, my father fired me from my part-time volunteer position as the manager of his deli. He said he was tired of paying all my living expenses. The final straw was when I took money out of his cash drawer while he was gone. He told me to go get a job so I could pay rent on his duplex I was living in.

Dad was tired of my divorces, my drinking, my unreliability, and my enormous sense of entitlement. I justified my bad behavior by using a tragedy that had occurred when I was 22. My first child was killed when a dumpster fell and crushed him. He was barely 3 years old. After he died, I dove into the bottle to kill the pain, and 12 years later I was still struggling. Those around me had a difficult time dealing with my inability ...

to turn my life around.

One day my best friend showed up. I hadn't seen her for months and, frankly, I hadn't even noticed she had dropped me. She said she wanted to see me. We grew up one block from each other. We drank our first drink together and smoked our first joint together. I was thrilled to see her because I figured the party would be on! She showed up with her new boyfriend, a wild-looking biker covered with tattoos from wrists to neck. But there was something different about my old friend. She was much calmer than I'd ever seen her. She didn't want the drink I offered, and she wasn't interested in other party favors either. In fact, she informed me that she was sober.

I was dumbfounded. She suggested that I might look around to see if my life might be a little out of control. She was glowing. She'd been sober for six months and was trying to Twelfth Step me. I thanked her, wished her well and brushed her off. But I was unable to put what she said and how she looked out of my mind. Three days later I walked into my first AA meeting.

The meeting was held just two doors down from one of my favorite bars. I was scared someone I knew would see me when I entered. I looked everyone over and told myself that I wasn't as bad as them. I had difficulty accepting that I was out of control because I had a place to live, a car, cable TV and my family still wanted me around. Still, I tried to not drink.

Not drinking was not easy. I had been drinking a fifth of brandy a day for some time. I was shaky in the morning and I white-knuckled my way through the day without a drink, but when 5 P.M. rolled around I was thirsty. I needed to be at that 6 P.M. meeting. Soon I was going to three meetings a day, often bringing my son with me. But I didn't ask for help as I did not want to tell anyone how raw I was feeling.

I heard people talk about sleeping on the street and eating out of dumpsters and losing their children and I was glad I wasn't "that bad." But then something changed when some of them talked about the "hole in the soul." That phrase got my attention. I could relate to that. How, in the beginning, alcohol took away their bad feelings and let them feel they were part of something. Then the addiction would take over. I saw how my former cure became the source of new pain. Slowly I began to realize the truth about myself. I focused on my inside instead of my outside.

I got a sponsor. She was strong and she unwaveringly deflected my attempts to manipulate. She loved me no matter what self-indulgent nonsense came out of my mouth. She steered me through the Steps and we talked about the hole in my soul and that helped me relate to everyone else.

It's been 33 years now since I've had a drink or a drug. I have so much gratitude for my sobriety and for my God who filled that hole in my soul. I sometimes see "me" walk into meetings now and whenever I do, I make myself available to her, especially if she talks about being "not that bad."



# **Service Positions Available**

The district is also looking for an interim alternate DCM at this time. Many thanks to Lori Ann S. for her time in service. A minimum of four years is required for this position. Please attend the district meeting where you will be asked to provide your service resume. If more than one person stands for the position, the GSRs will then vote.

Another position which is available is PI/CPC, also known as Public Information/Cooperation with the Professional Community Committee. Members of PI/CPC committees across the nations inform the public, professionals, and future professional (such as

We had a special speaker from the General Service Board, our interim chair, Mike L. What a speaker, from what it was like to what his life is now. Many workshops are available for all AA members to attend, whatever you are interested in at any level of service. All are part of how AA works.




