The AA Grapevine is the international journal of Alcoholics Anonymous (AA). It shares the AA message with those interested in recovering from alcoholism. The Grapevine is known as a "meeting in print".

The AA Grapevine is a monthly magazine for members of Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) and others interested in recovery. It is also called the "International Journal of Alcoholics Anonymous".

Features: First-person stories, AA news, new AA group reports, book reviews, magazine reprints, and contributions from non-AA members.

Historical Background: The inaugural issue was released in June 1944 by six members of Alcoholics Anonymous in New York. The magazine's history mirrors the growth of AA.

How to get involved: You can buy single copies at local AA meetings; You can subscribe to receive the magazine regularly; You can volunteer or be elected to become a Grapevine representative (GVR); You can contribute to the magazine; You can use the magazine in Twelfth Step work.

Funding: The AA Grapevine is funded by subscriptions and item sales.

What is in the AA Grapevine? First-person stories; Letters; Humor; Member art; Discussions of recovery, unity, and service; Sections on the medical, legal, and social aspects of alcoholism.

Who produces the AA Grapevine? A team of AA members skilled in editing, writing, and art.


How often is the AA Grapevine published? A new edition is released each month.

How did the AA Grapevine get its name? The name was meant to imply clear communication.

Interesting Facts: Early AA groups adopted the AA Grapevine as the international journal of Alcoholics Anonymous in 1946. The General Service Conference reaffirmed this designation in 1986. Conference Advisory Action, 1986: "Since each issue of the Grapevine cannot go through the Conference-approval process, the Conference recognizes the Grapevine as the international journal of Alcoholics Anonymous."

These personal accounts illustrate the challenges alcoholics in uniform encounter, often under difficult circumstances, far from loved ones.

I was introduced to the charming, attractive, vibrant young lady who also was a very good dancer and by God's intervention we hit it off.

I was soon to find out that she had five years as a member of Alcoholics Anonymous.

The meeting began with a prayer and various members reading from different books. The last reading was from the Fifth Chapter of the book, Alcoholics Anonymous, How It Works. As the reader reached the point where he began "Here are the steps we took", my friend poked me in the ribs and pointed to the window shade on the left. I began to read along and when I read Step Three I unknowingly had my first spiritual experience.

The words "the care of God, <u>as we understood Him</u>" struck a chord in my heart.

It was not the God of the church of my upbringing, the one that held the little old ladies in the first pew who said I was going to go to hell if I did not stop acting like a wild Tasmanian devil.

How right they were, my alcoholic drinking had given me a life of hell.

A few more meetings, a sponsor and the first step soon made me realize that I was an alcoholic and I soon made the confession at a meeting, my name is Mike and I am an alcoholic.



The young lady eventually became my wife when she announced that we were getting married. Until her death in 2020 we spent 27 sober years together enjoying a happy life but never forgetting the hell we had to go through to get there.


