

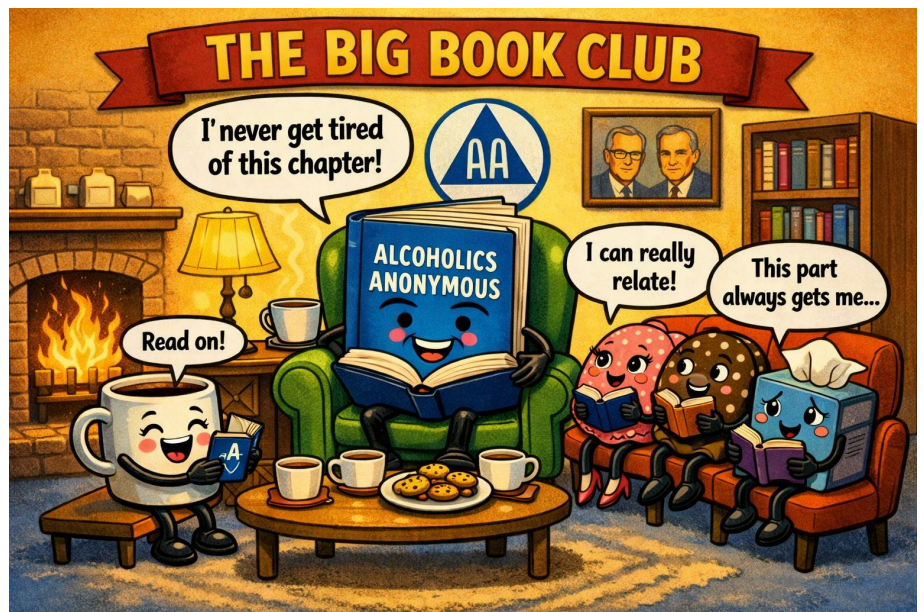

Group Spotlight

Public Service Announcement for All Bell Avenue, Brooksville Groups

This is a repeat from August 2025. Our DCM, Mark S., has been informed that parking issues persist at 250 Bell Ave. Parking on the grass behind the church is no longer permitted. Last month, a sewer line was damaged. There is a handicap ramp along Bell Ave., a parking lot beneath the church accessible from Bell Ave., as shown in the second picture, and a grass parking lot on Olive St. When parking in the grass lot across from the church on Olive Street, please park parallel to the street as illustrated in the first picture, not perpendicular. Additionally, we are asked not to block the trash cans shown in the third picture to allow the trash hauler access. We must be responsible tenants and maintain a positive impression by following these guidelines.

Key Points of AA Step 5

Step 5: *“Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.”*

It is the “confession” step, where the moral inventory from Step 4 is spoken out loud to God, yourself, and another person.

Its purpose is honesty, accountability, and connection, breaking the isolation and secrecy that fuel addiction.

It exposes the patterns, defects, and harms that only survive “in the dark,” allowing healing to begin.

It reduces shame, which is a major driver of addiction, by sharing the truth with someone safe and understanding.

It prepares you for Steps 6–7, where you become ready for character change and spiritual growth.

How to Work Step 5

1. Overcome the Fear of Telling the Truth

Fear is normal. Step 4 prepared you for this moment. Acknowledge the fear but move forward anyway—honesty is the doorway to freedom.

2. Admit Your Wrongs to Yourself First

Before sharing with anyone else, sit quietly with your Step 4 inventory and accept the truth of what you wrote.

3. Choose the Right Person to Hear Your Step 5

Most people choose a sponsor, clergy member, or trusted AA member—someone who understands addiction and will not judge.

4. Share the Exact Nature of Your Wrongs

This includes:

- Feelings
- Experiences
- Secrets
- Character defects
- Harmful behaviors

Be honest, specific, and thorough—without minimizing or exaggerating.

5. Allow Yourself to Be Vulnerable

This step requires openness and humility. Vulnerability breaks denial and self-delusion.

6. Reflect on What You Learn

After sharing, many people feel relief, clarity, and a sense of no longer living a “double life.” [Alcohol](#)

7. Prepare Spiritually for the Next Steps

Step 5 clears the ground so you can begin asking your Higher Power to remove the defects you’ve now fully acknowledged.

Reflection Questions for Step 5

(You can edit or expand these for worksheets or meetings.)

- How long have I carried these secrets?
- What fears come up when I think about sharing them?
- What patterns do I see in my harms and defects?
- What relief do I hope to feel after completing Step 5?

The best way to overcome fear of AA Step 5 is to face it with preparation, trust, and spiritual courage — not perfection.

Fear is natural, but it loses power when you bring it into the light through honesty, prayer, and safe connection.

Accept That Fear Is Normal

AA’s *Big Book* says Step 5 “deflates our egos” and goes against natural instincts — so fear is expected. Many try to avoid or minimize this step, but holding back keeps the pain alive. Recognizing fear as part of the process helps you move through it rather than around it.

Remember Why You’re Doing It

Step 5 is not about punishment — it’s about **freedom**. You’re admitting your wrongs “to God, to yourself, and to another human being” so you can stop living with secrets and shame. Sharing truth breaks isolation and begins healing.

Pray for Willingness

Before your Step 5, ask your Higher Power for courage and honesty. Many AA members pray something simple like:

“God, help me to be honest and fearless. Let me see the truth and share it without shame.”

Key Points of AA Step 5

Step 5: “Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.”

- ✓ The “confession step” where you share your Step 4 inventory out loud
- ✓ Breaks isolation and secrecy, fostering honesty and connection
- ✓ Exposes defects and harms that need healing
- ✓ Reduces shame and prepares you for change.

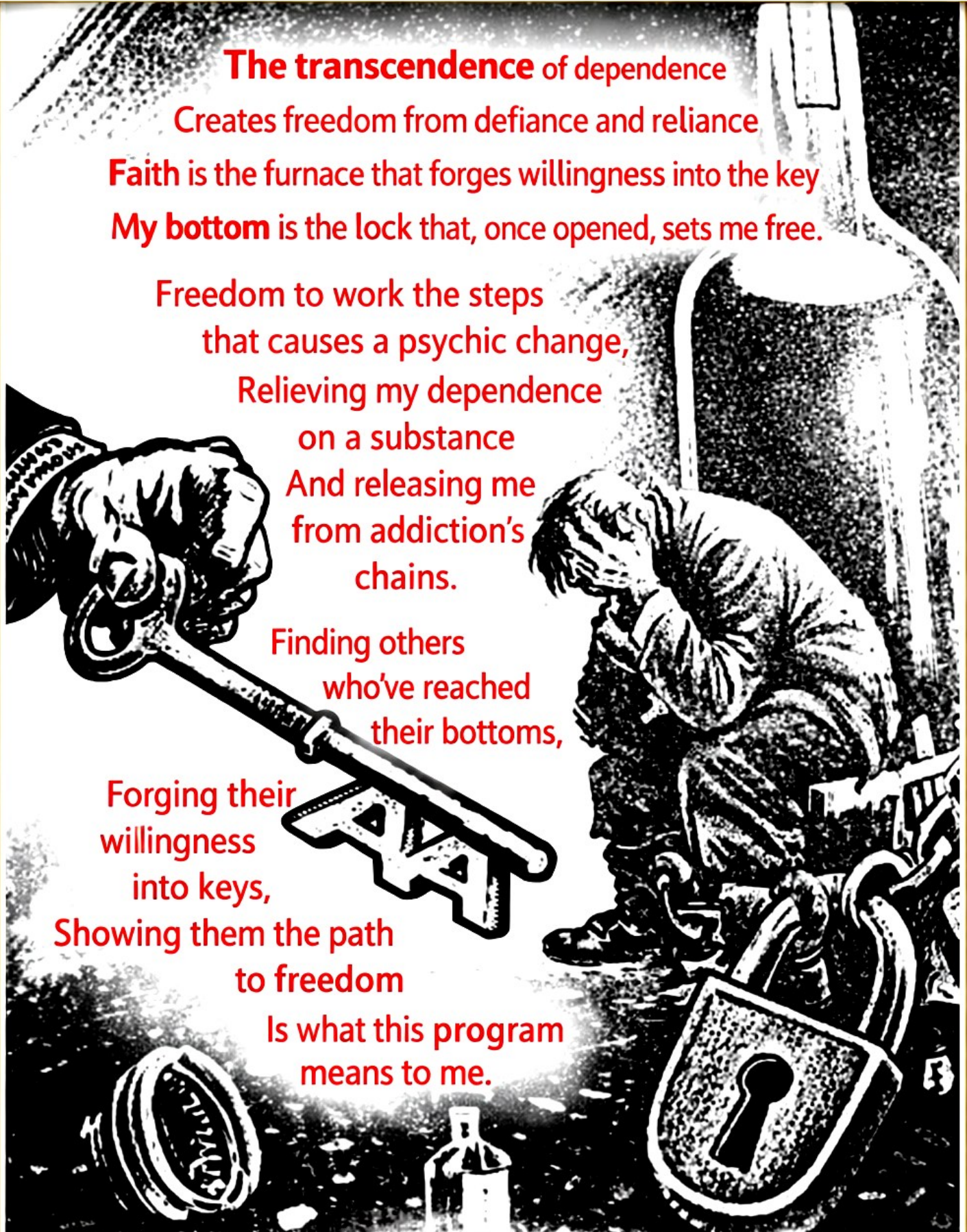

“Just Another Bozo on the Bus”

For a while, I lived on a train with the Ringling Brothers and Barnum & Bailey Circus. One morning, I woke up and the world had shifted — the train was silent, everyone gone. The regular bus I took to work had vanished too. In its place sat another bus, empty, waiting.

I stumbled toward it, hungover and hollow — no cigarettes, no money, nothing to dull the ache. The driver looked at me and said, “Hey kid, this one’s going to the same place.” So I climbed aboard.

Then the door of a nearby building swung open, and out poured a parade of clowns and midgets — laughing, shouting, alive. They came tumbling toward the bus, all happy, joyous, and free. And there I was, restless, irritable, and discontented — twenty-one years old, lost in frustration and despair.

They climbed aboard with their painted smiles and bright costumes, and I sat there, heavy and gray inside, watching them fill the seats around me. That day, I realized something I couldn’t yet name. I was just another bozo on the bus.

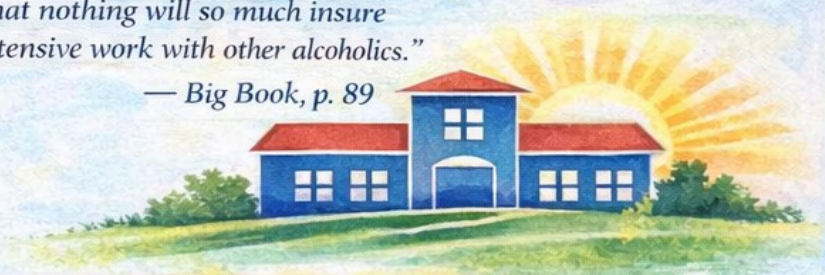

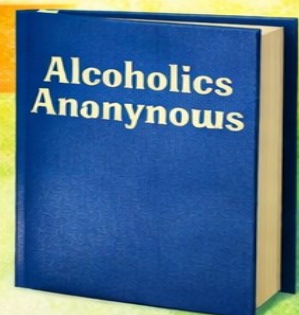
